Dear Secretary-General,

Re: Application for NGO observer status

On behalf of the Environmental Justice Foundation, I would like to express my congratulations for your work chairing the ISA Secretariat and leading the regulation of mining activity in the Area, for the benefit of all mankind and considering the effective protection of the marine environment from the harmful effects that may arise from seabed activities.

As the mining code rulemaking process is at a crucial stage this year, EJF requests to obtain observer status in accordance with article 169 of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, rule 82, paragraph 1 (e), of the Rules of Procedure of the Assembly of the International Seabed Authority and the guidelines for observer status of non-governmental organizations with the International Seabed Authority.

EJF exists to protect the natural world and defend our basic human right to a secure environment. We work internationally to inform policy and drive systemic, durable reforms to protect our environment and defend human rights. We investigate and expose abuses and support environmental defenders, Indigenous peoples, communities and independent journalists on the frontlines of environmental injustice. Our campaigns aim to secure peaceful, equitable and sustainable futures.

The focus areas of EJF's work are human rights and the environment, marine biodiversity and coastal protection, strengthening environmental governance and public participation, and the reduction of factors that drive climate change.

EJF is working to protect our oceans, primarily by ending illegal fishing and stamping out the human rights abuses driven by this illicit activity. By doing so we aim to protect the millions of people that depend on our oceans and for the magnificent and varied wildlife that call them home.

We now include deep-sea mining as one of our core areas of focus, and are advocating for a science-based and precautionary approach.

We believe that our experience and the work we have developed over more than 20 years to protect our oceans will be an important contribution to the current stage of development of the Mining Code regulation. We anticipate contributing our expertise to the Authority's work on the effective protection of the marine environment, as well as the equitable benefit sharing of deep-sea resources.

EJF campaigns to protect the marine environment, its biodiversity and the livelihoods dependent on it. This is aligned with the Authority's mandate to ensure the effective protection of the marine environment from harmful effects that may arise from deep-seabed-related activities.

To date EJF has been sharing information related to the environmental implications of deep-sea

mining with policymakers in Germany, the UK, and key departments within the EU. EJF also recently wrote to a number of council delegates with this statement, with the aim of protecting biodiversity and marine ecosystems.

EJF intends to contribute to the work of the authority by representing the best interests of the marine environment, its biodiversity and the livelihoods dependent on it. Our team of expert researchers have recently synthesized an extensive literature review covering the potential impacts of deep-sea mining, and EJF has been sharing this information with relevant stakeholders. We intend to contribute to the Authority's work by championing environmental protections and sharing well-researched information with relevant decision makers.

EJF has campaigned for the protection of marine environments, its biodiversity and the livelihoods dependent on it for over 20 years. Our international teams of researchers, investigators, campaigners, grassroots liaisons, film teams and policy experts have worked to end the injustice of some of the biggest threats to our oceans, in particular those posed by illegal, unregulated and reported fishing. We've exposed the modern-day slavery propping up Thailand's seafood sector, provided irrefutable evidence of illegal fishing in West Africa, secured protection for unique coastal forests in Brazil and gathered powerful first-hand testimonials from those living on the frontlines of climate change.

EJF is experienced in capacity-building programming in initiatives across multiple countries in Western Africa.
