For DR31(1), whichever formulation is chosen, we recommend re-insertion of reference to Standards, to leave open the possibility that this may be a subject on which binding subsidiary instruments are found to be useful. We also consider it important that REMPs are referenced here, as the ISA's policy tool for mapping out other marine uses in the relevant region.

Regarding 2alt, prior identification of marine users in a particular region will be necessary in order to facilitate coordination. The REMP would appear to be a key tool in this regard for the ISA itself, and so we suggest including explicit reference to this important role for REMPs herein 2alt, which we would preferred of the two options.
