Regulation 10 Preliminary review of application by the Secretary General

[Para 1 bis. In case there is a potential applicant who has preference and priority in the same area and same Resource category under Exploration contract, the Secretary General shall confirm the intention of such a potential applicant to apply].

In the event of a subsequent applicant claiming to have preference and priority in the same area and for the same Resource category under an Exploration Contract as an existing application, then the new applicant must announce their intention to lodge their application within 30 days of the original applicant's application. The new applicant shall then lodge their application within a further 60 days. The Secretary General shall consider the additional application in accordance with Regulation 10 (1).

Concerning para 2, several delegations suggested the identification of a clear deadline for the second applicant to announce its intention to apply in accordance with regulation 10 (1).

UK understanding is that any area under consideration should have been the subject of an exploration contract prior to any exploitation contract. But in the unlikely event of a secondary application occurring for the same area, to avoid legal uncertainty, the UK considers that the second applicant must lodge their application within 90 days of the first application.
