We intervened on DR 44/DR 44 ter (16 July) re the required implementation of Article 145 (a)'s obligation to develop rules, regulations and procedures to prevent, reduce and control interference with the ecological balance of the marine environment. Adequate implementation also entails, e.g., inclusion in the EIA process. Ecological balance comprises more than ecosystem functions, especially as the two prior elements in this list focus on the ecosystem and do not refer to, e.g., abiotic components of the marine environment, except through their linkages with biotic components generally focused on when assessing ecosystem status. We noted proposals to include ecological balance in prior drafts of these regulations. This is required for the Exploitation Regulations to adequately implement UNCLOS to protect and preserve the marine environment. We will submit additional proposals re inclusion of the ecological balance requirement in these regulations, including Annex IV, and other textual proposals, to the Secretariat.
