In the Introduction (paragraph 3) of the standardized procedure for the development, establishment and review of regional environmental management plans (REMPs) important outcomes from the development of a REMP in a specific region are included. These outcomes are mainly related to information provided to the Authority, Contractors and sponsoring States. However, the development and approval of the REMP may also provide regional environmental information to adjacent coastal States. As resource deposits in the Area may lie across limits of national jurisdiction, natural environments may also cross limits of national jurisdiction. Therefore, the REMP will provide important environmental information and, if applicable, important levels of environmental protection to areas within national jurisdiction of adjacent coastal States.

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5.bis – Regional environmental plans should contribute, whenever possible, to enhancing cooperation among relevant legal instruments and frameworks and relevant regional, subregional and sectoral bodies in the achievement of the protection and sustainable use of the marine environment.

Regional environmental management plans and other area management tools adopted under relevant different legal instruments frameworks and bodies, namely, but not only under the BBNJ Agreement, should, whenever possible, contribute for a coherent environmentally connected management network through cooperation for the protection and conservation of the natural resources of the Area and the prevention of damage of the marine environment.
