## The Design Process - Initial Concepts



#### INSPIRATION

The circle symbol represents a wide range of universal concepts, including wholeness, unity, infinity, and eternity due to its continuous, unbroken, and symmetrical nature with no beginning or end. It symbolizes life's cyclical journey such as seasons and growth, as well as divinity, perfection, and balance across various cultures.

The main inspiration is the "golden ratio", closely related to the Fibonacci sequence, where each number is the sum of the two preceding ones. The golden ratio symbolizes harmony, balance, and natural beauty, as it is found in various aspects of nature, represents a universal principle of balance and proportion, where larger and smaller elements relate to each other in a pleasing and naturally occurring way. This visually presented mathematical principle also represents the balance between nature and technology.

Shells: The logarithmic spirals of many shells, such as the nautilus, can resemble the Golden Spiral, though not all shells adhere to this exact proportion.

Human Anatomy: Proportions of the human body, like the ratio of forearm to hand length or features of the face, are sometimes said to approximate the Golden Ratio.

Technology: In technology and engineering, the influence of the Golden Ratio is not purely aesthetic but extends to functionality and ergonomic design.

Galaxies: Even at cosmic scales, patterns in the Milky Way galaxy and other spiral galaxies can exhibit Fibonacci patterns.

The colors are taken from the deep sea environment, but also photographs of galaxies and deep space, which carry a similar symbolism of mystery and some kind of magic as the deep sea.



















## The Design Process - Initial Concepts



#### INSPIRATION

The circle symbol represents a wide range of universal concepts, including wholeness, unity, infinity, and eternity due to its continuous, unbroken, and symmetrical nature with no beginning or end.

It symbolizes life's cyclical journey such as seasons and growth, as well as divinity, perfection, and balance across various cultures.

Horizontal lines evoke a sense of calmness and quiet. Like horizontal lines, curves convey a sense of comfort. Because these lines have a gentle natural flow, they are connected to nature and all things organic.

The straight and slightly wavy lines at the bottom symbolize the earth and deep layers of water, suggest a feeling of stability, represent peace, rest and elaxation.

The more dynamic wavy lines towards the top symbolize the different depths of water, as well as the activities carried out at all levels.

The colors are taken from the deep sea environment, but also from images of the ocean from space. They also give a sense of harmony, depth, diversity, and mystery.









#### Decision of the Assembly of the International Seabed Authority on the designation of 1 November as the International Day of the Deep Seabed

The Assembly of the International Seabed Authority,

Celebrating the thirtieth anniversary of the International Scabed Authority, which was established under the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 (the Convention).

Recalling the inspirational speech delivered by Ambassador Arvid Pardo on 1 November 1967 before the United Nations General Assembly for the legal regime applicable to the common heritage of humankind as a whole,

Acknowledging the importance of the mandate entrusted to the International Seabed Authority by the Convention and the Agreement relating to the Implementation of Part XI of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982, 2 as the organization through which States Parties shall organize and control activities in the Area.

Highlighting the importance of building deep-sea literacy to raise awareness of the legal regime to govern all activities regarding exploration for and exploitation of the resources of the Area, which are the common heritage of humankind as a whole, as well as the role of the Authority in advancing deep-sea research and in leveraging the capacity-building activities of the Authority,

Noting the need to accelerate investment in science and technology to advance global knowledge and understanding of the Area for the benefit of humankind as a whole.

 Decides to proclaim 1 November as the International Day of the Deep Seabed, to be observed annually;

The International Day of the Deep Seabed is the world's first international day dedicated to the deep seabed in areas beyond national jurisdiction, « the Area ». Endorsed by the <u>Assembly of the International Seabed Authority (ISA) during its 30th session</u> in July 2025, the International Day of the Deep Seabed will be observed annually on 1 November.

It was established to provide an occasion for the international community to consider and discuss:

- The principle of the common heritage of mankind.
- The role of the legal regime for the Area as set out in the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS) and the 1994 Agreement on the implementation of Part XI of UNCLOS, which established the rule of law in the Area, including with respect to its conservation and sustainable use.
- The importance of the ISA's mandate to elaborate and conclude rules, regulations and procedures relating to the exploitation of the mineral resources of the Area, which will provide the regulatory framework to ensure the orderly conduct of mineral resourcerelated activities and the effective protection of the marine environment.
- The role of the ISA in advancing deep sea research, harnessing science and technology, and building the capacity of developing countries, towards advancing global knowledge and understanding of the Area for informed decision-making.

# Governance and Mandate Delivery

The Earth Law Center's Ocean Program introduces A Voice for Coral Reef Ecosystems through Ecocentric Law, which is a three-part Rights of Coral Reefs Toolkit that equips policymakers, advocates, and legal professionals with ecocentric strategies grounded in rights, guardianship, and ecological kinship. 

Upholding the Common Heritage of Humankind:

a call for global stewardship of the deep seabed.

Colleagues, friends and citizens of the world,

Before I reflect on the historical origin of this important moment, I must take the opportunity to acknowledge the catastrophic weather event, the category 5 Hurricane Melissa, that unleashed the strongest winds ever to hit the island nation of Jamaica four days ago; our headquarters for the International Seabed Authority. As we rode out the storm together, I felt the weight of having responsibility of our staff and our families. We have made it through safely and I could not be more proud of the courage, kindness and solidarity that my team demonstrated under the greatest pressure. I also want to thank the government of Jamaica for the exceptional organization and preparations that were fundamental to ensuring that more damage was not done and more lives lost in this monster storm. I speak for ISA when I say our hearts go out to the government and people of Jamaica who will now have to start the process of recovery, hand in hand, rebuilding spirts as well as infrastructure. We stand at the ready to support in any way we can. This is our home and we stand together.

On a hopeful front, today, 1 November 2025, I am honoured to announce the very first International Day of the Deep Seabed, proposed by the governments of Fiji, Jamaica, Malta and Singapore.

Nearly 60 years ago, on 1 November 1967, Maltese diplomat Arvid Pardo stood before the United Nations and called on humanity to treat the seabed beyond national jurisdiction as the common heritage of humankind. His words were visionary.

International Day of the Deep Seabed was a "full-and-across-the-house effort" that included:


- Drafting and reviewing key messages
